


What is it?


Smarthinking is an online 24/7 tutoring service available to ALL NAU students. You can get live help from a tutor on everything from paper writing to math, business, and nursing coursework.

Where do I find it?

You can get to Smarthinking via D2L or the Student Portal:

How does it work?

Smarthinking offers drop-in tutoring services and scheduled tutoring appointments.

Writing Assistance: If you have questions about grammar, APA style, organization, or general writing questions, choose Writing (All Subjects) in the "Work with a Tutor" section. You can also use this option for pre-writing support for brainstorming, outlining, or thesis development.

Math, Science, Business, & Nursing Assistance: Choose your subject area in the "Work with a Tutor" section.

Keep in mind – if you use the drop-in tutoring services there aren't always tutors available in specialized subject areas. If you plan ahead, you can schedule a time in advance (48 hours) and ensure that someone with that subject expertise will be available.

What is it?

Learning Express is a tutorial database available from the NAU Online Library. It contains practice tests and tutorials to help you learn math, reading, and writing skills. It also contains tools to help you learn how to use software like Microsoft Word, Excel, Powerpoint, and more.

Where do I find it?

You can access Learning Express from the [NAU Online Library home page](#) – there is a link for Learning Express near the bottom of the page. You can also access it using the links in the “How does it work?” section, below.

How does it work?

Learning Express is divided into “Centers” – each Center focuses on a different skill. When you find a resource you want to use within a center, click on the link to launch it.

[Career Center \(entrance and occupational exam tutorials\)](#)

Note: You will need to register for a (free) Learning Express account the first time you use a Learning Express resource. When you graduate from NAU, you'll still be able to access Learning Express to brush up on skills or learn new ones!

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Campus Tutoring

What is it?

Many campuses have tutors available who can assist you with your questions on a variety of subjects. In addition to being available on campus, many tutors are available to help you via phone and email, too.

Where do I find it?

How does it work?
