



Getting Started

You can download 2 different versions of Zotero – one that integrates into the Firefox browser and a standalone version that works with Chrome, Safari, or Firefox. You can download either version here: <https://www.zotero.org>

If you download the standalone version, you'll also need to download browser connectors for the browsers you use (the connectors are available on the Zotero download page).

Setting up a Zotero account

Setting up an account allows you to back up and sync your Zotero library online and is a requirement if you want to save to your Zotero library from multiple devices. You don't have to set up an account but can't sync or share without doing so. You can create an account here: <https://www.zotero.org/user/login>

Using Zotero on multiple devices

You can sync Zotero to save your library on multiple devices. After you set up a Zotero account, go to your Zotero Library's preferences and enter your account information in the "Sync" tab: <https://www.zotero.org/support/preferences/sync>

Word Processor plugins

Zotero's word processor plugins give you the option to insert bibliographies and citations into your word processor documents. If you use the Firefox version of Zotero, you need to download the Word plugin separately from the Zotero download page.
